DISPOSITION: CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORITY CANCELLED

On September 12, 1994, Metropolitan Fiber Systems Of Oregon Inc. was granted a certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 94-1376.

In a letter dated November 6, 2003, describing a restructuring and related intra-corporate transactions of MCI Worldcom Inc., it was determined that the certificate of authority for Metropolitan Fiber Systems of Oregon Inc., a subsidiary of MCI Worldcom, should be cancelled. In an electronic correspondence of December 3, 2003, from Susan Travis of MCI Worldcom Inc. to OPUC staff, it was confirmed that the company's certificate of authority should be cancelled. The company is reminded that because it had a certificate of authority for one or more days in 2003, it is required to file a Form GRT and pay a minimum of \$100 for that year.

In view of the foregoing, the certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service in Oregon held by Metropolitan Fiber Systems Of Oregon Inc. should be cancelled.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of authority held by Metropolitan Fiber Systems Of Oregon Inc. is cancelled.
