DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On December 24, 2001, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to QualityLife Intergovernmental Agency (QualityLife) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 01-1093. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to pay annual revenue fees to the Commission. A fee statement was sent to QualityLife on April 19, 2004, and late notices were sent on May 17 and June 15, 2004. After investigation, the Commission found that QualityLife failed to pay fees as required in ORS 756.310. At the July 20, 2004 public meeting, the Commission determined that QualityLife's certificate of authority should be canceled. QualityLife's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 04-435.

On August 27, 2004, QualityLife filed a request to suspend Order No. 04-435, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that QualityLife paid the requested fees on June 29, 2004.

The fees sent by QualityLife to the Commission were late. However, the fees have been received and indicate QualityLife is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of QualityLife's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 04-435 canceling the certificate of authority of QualityLife Intergovernmental Agency, is rescinded.
