## DISPOSITION: CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORITY CANCELLED

On June 26, 2001, Verizon Avenue Corp. was granted a certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 01-529.

No revenue fees were paid for 2004 as required by ORS 756.310. On April 28, 2005, the Commission notified the certificate holder that the required fees were not received. On June 16, 2005, a Fee Assessment Order in docket No. FA 527, Order No. 05-795, was sent to the company.

ORS 756.515(4) provides that the Commission may, after investigation, but without hearing, make such findings and orders as deemed justified by the results of the investigation. In view of the foregoing, the Commission determined at its August 2, 2005, Public Meeting that the certificate holder has failed to comply with Commission rules and terms of the certificate. The certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service should be cancelled, per OAR 860-032-0008(2).

The Commission notes that this is the second time it has canceled a certificate held by the certificate holder. Before the Commission will process any future application for certification, the certificate holder must fully comply with Commission rules. Any future application must include:

- 1. Payment of all revenue fees, including late payment fees, owed for each calendar year of operation pursuant to ORS 756.310(6)(a), in accordance with Commission requirements;
- 2. Confirmation of compliance with Oregon Universal Service Fund requirements pursuant to ORS 759.425; and
- 3. Annual reports for each calendar year of operation pursuant to OAR 860-032-0060.

The certificate holder must include all fees and documents for each year of operation, regardless of whether it held a valid certificate of authority from this Commission. In addition, the certificate holder must provide information to the Commission why it

believes it is in the public interest to again grant a certificate of authority to an entity that has repeatedly ignored Commission rules. The Commission will evaluate the information to help determine whether to grant the application. If the certificate holder fails to include these items in its application, the Commission will deem the application incomplete and return it.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of authority held by Verizon Avenue Corp. is cancelled.
