DISPOSITION: CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORITY CANCELLED

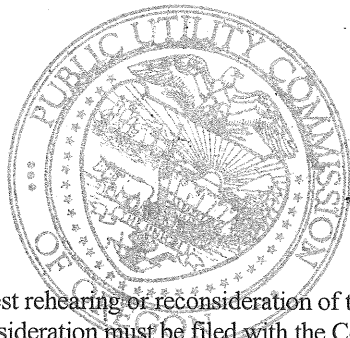
On June 26, 2001, One Point Communications-Colorado LLC was granted a certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. See Order No. 01-529. The company later changed its name to Verizon Avenue Corporation.

In a letter dated February 17, 2006, Renee Willer, of Verizon Northwest, Inc., requested that the certificate of authority for Verizon Avenue Corporation be cancelled. The company has no customers in Oregon. The company is reminded that because it had a certificate of authority for one or more days in 2006, it is required to file a Form GRT and pay a minimum of \$100 for that year.

In view of the foregoing, the certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service in Oregon held by Verizon Avenue Corporation should be cancelled.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of authority held by Verizon Avenue Corporation is cancelled.
