DISPOSITION: AGREEMENT APPROVED; FIRST AMENDMENT WITHDRAWN.

Cordia Communications Corp. and Qwest Corporation filed a negotiated interconnection agreement and a First Amendment to the Interconnection Agreement, on January 19, and February 7, 2006, respectively, with the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission). On March 8, 2006, Qwest Corporation filed a letter withdrawing the subsequent first amendment to the negotiated interconnection agreement.

The parties seek approval of this agreement under Section 252(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996. The Commission provided notice by posting an electronic copy of the agreement and amendment on the World Wide Web, at: http://www.puc.state.or.us/caragmnt/. Only the Commission Staff (Staff) filed comments.

Under the Act, the Commission must approve or reject an agreement reached through voluntary negotiation within 90 days of filing. The Commission may reject an agreement only if it finds that:

- (1) the agreement (or portion thereof) discriminates against a telecommunications carrier not a party to the agreement; or
- (2) the implementation of such agreement or portion is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

An interconnection agreement or amendment thereto has no effect or force until approved by a state Commission. *See* 47 U.S.C. Sections 252 (a) and (e). Accordingly, the effective date of these filings will be the date the Commission signs an order approving them, and any provision stating that the parties' agreement or amendment is effective prior to that date is not enforceable.

Staff recommended approval of the agreement. Staff concluded that the agreement does not appear to discriminate against telecommunications carriers who are not parties to the agreement and amendment and does not appear to be inconsistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

OPINION

The Commission adopts Staff's recommendations and concludes that there is no basis under the Act to reject the agreement. No participant in the proceeding has requested that the agreement be rejected or has presented any reason for rejection. Accordingly, the agreement should be approved.

CONCLUSIONS

- 1. There is no basis for finding that the agreement discriminates against any telecommunications carriers who are not parties to the agreement.
- 2. There is no basis for finding that implementation of the agreement is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.
- 3. The agreement should be approved.
- 4. The request to withdraw the subsequent first amendment to the negotiated interconnection agreement is granted.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The agreement between Cordia Communications Corp. and Qwest Corporation, is approved.
- 2. The first amendment, is dismissed without prejudice.
