DISPOSITION: AMENDMENTS APPROVED

On May 26, and June 22, 2006, Integra Telecom of Oregon, Inc., and Qwest Corporation filed the eighteenth, nineteenth, and twentieth amendments, respectively, to the interconnection agreement previously acknowledged by the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission), recognizing the adoption of ARB 3 terms. Subsequent amendments were approved with Orders No. 00-575, 00-629, 01-793, 01-917, 02-081, 02-241, 02-597, 03-113, 03-555, 04-118, 04-175, 05-098, 05-215, 05-915, 05-1018, and 06-208. The parties seek approval of the current amendments under Section 252(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996. The Commission provided notice by posting electronic copies of the amendments on the World Wide Web, at: <http://www.puc.state.or.us/caragmnt/>. Only the Commission Staff (Staff) filed comments.

Under the Act, the Commission must approve or reject an agreement reached through voluntary negotiation within 90 days of filing. The Commission may reject an agreement only if it finds that:

- (1) the agreement (or portion thereof) discriminates against a telecommunications carrier not a party to the agreement; or
- (2) the implementation of such agreement or portion is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

An interconnection agreement or amendment thereto has no effect or force until approved by a state Commission. See 47 U.S.C. Sections 252 (a) and (e). Accordingly, the effective date of this filing will be the date the Commission signs an order approving it, and any provision stating that the parties' amendments are effective prior to that date is not enforceable.

Staff recommended approval of the amendment. Staff concluded that the amendments to the previously acknowledged agreement do not appear to discriminate against telecommunications carriers who are not parties to the agreement and do not appear to be inconsistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

OPINION

The Commission adopts Staff's recommendation and concludes that there is no basis under the Act to reject the amendments to the previously acknowledged agreement. No participant in the proceeding has requested that the amendments be rejected or has presented any reason for rejection. Accordingly, the amendments should be approved.


CONCLUSIONS

- 1. There is no basis for finding that the amendments to the previously acknowledged agreement discriminate against any telecommunications carrier not a party to the agreement.
- 2. There is no basis for finding that implementation of the amended agreement is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.
- 3. The amendments should be approved.

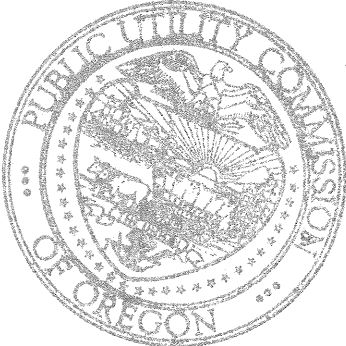
ORDER
