**DISPOSITION: MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE  
DOCUMENT IN COMPLIANCE WITH ORDER  
GRANTED**

On March 20, 2007, the Commission issued Order No. 07-109 that required, among other things, Qwest Corporation (Qwest) file a document setting forth certain procedures related to wire center classifications consistent with the terms of the order. The order required Qwest to make the filing within 30 days, or by April 19, 2007.

On April 18, 2007, Qwest and the Joint Competitive Locale Exchange Carriers (CLECs) filed a request for an extension of time to file the requested procedures. The parties explain that Qwest and the Joint CLECs have been negotiating a settlement of the wire center non-impairment issues throughout the Qwest region, and that the required procedures are among the issues that are being addressed. The parties add that settlement discussions are scheduled to continue next week in the hopes that the parties can reach a final resolution. For this reason, the parties seek a 30-day extension to comply with the order.

The request for extension of time is granted.

**ORDER**

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 07-109 is modified to require that Qwest Corporation file procedures for the evaluation and implementation of future wire center classifications no later than May 21, 2007.
