DISPOSITION: PETITION GRANTED

On May 24, 2007, PacifiCorp, dba Pacific Power & Light Company (PacifiCorp or Company), filed a petition, with the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission), requesting the Commission waive the filing requirements under OAR 860-038-0300(2) and (3) for the second quarter of 2007. These rules require the company to report to customers the price, power source and environmental impacts for each of its services and products in a format prescribed by the Commission.


OAR 860-038-0001(4) allows the Commission to relieve a utility of the requirements of any Division 38 rule for good cause shown. PacifiCorp's petition demonstrates that customers would benefit from the waiver by ensuring that power source and environmental impact information provided to customers properly reflects the company's resource mix after accounting for sales of green tags from renewable resource facilities. Staff's recommendation is contained in the Staff Report, attached as Appendix A, and incorporated by reference.

At its Public Meeting on June 19, 2007, the Commission adopted Staff's recommendation, and approved PacifiCorp's petition for waiver of these filing requirements.


ORDER

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Commission approve PacifiCorp's petition for waiver of the filing requirements for quarterly fuel mix inserts for the second quarter of 2007.

DISCUSSION:

On May 24, 2007, Pacific Power & Light (PacifiCorp or company) filed a petition requesting the Commission waive the filing requirements under OAR 860-038-0300(2) and (3) for the second quarter of 2007. These rules require the company to report to customers the price, power source and environmental impacts for each of its services and products in a format prescribed by the Commission.

Staff recommends the Commission grant the requested waiver. OAR 860-038-0001(4) allows the Commission to relieve a utility of the requirements of any Division 38 rule for good cause shown. PacifiCorp's petition demonstrates that customers would benefit from the waiver by ensuring that power source and environmental impact information provided to customers properly reflects the company's resource mix after accounting for sales of green tags from renewable resource facilities.¹ PacifiCorp should be allowed the time requested to reconcile renewable generation data with green tag sales data. Further, the waiver will provide sufficient time to allow the company to use 2006 regional

¹ Green tags, also called Renewable Energy Certificates or Tradable Renewable Credits, represent the environmental and other non-energy attributes of renewable resources. When green tags are sold, the associated power is not reported as a renewable resource in the fuel mix insert.

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emissions data from the Oregon Department of Energy, rather than data from 2005. The company will resume quarterly fuel mix inserts in August 2007.

PROPOSED COMMISSION MOTION:

PacifiCorp's petition for waiver of the filing requirements for quarterly fuel mix inserts for the second quarter of 2007 is approved.
