DISPOSITION: REALLOCATION APPROVED

The 2005 Legislature changed Oregon’s territory allocation law for telecommunications utilities and telecommunications cooperatives. The new law allocates local exchange telecommunications service territory as a geographic area within boundaries set forth in exchange maps filed with and approved by the Commission. This replaces the old “metes and bounds” descriptions. ORS 759.500(1).

Section 27, chapter 232, Oregon Laws 2005, directs the Commission to:


Reallocate every allocated local exchange telecommunications service territory to a telecommunications utility, cooperative corporation or municipality to whom the commission had previously allocated local exchange telecommunications service territory. Allocations granted by the commission pursuant to this subsection shall replace all allocations to telecommunications utilities, cooperative corporations or municipalities granted by the commission prior to January 1, 2006.

Staff recommends the reallocation of Canby Telephone Association’s (Canby) local exchange telecommunications service territory using the boundaries of exchange maps filed with and approved by the Commission, as set forth in Table 1 of Appendix A, replacing all previous territory allocations for Canby.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Canby Telephone Association's local exchange telecommunications service territory is reallocated using the boundaries of exchange maps filed with and approved by the Commission as set forth in Table 1 contained in Appendix A, replacing all previous territory allocations for Canby Telephone Association.

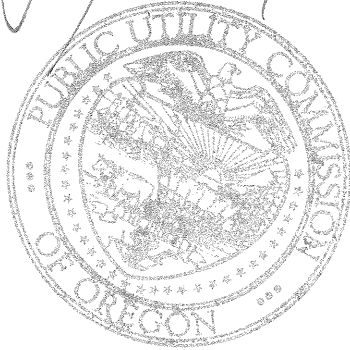

SUBJECT: OREGON PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION STAFF: Reallocation of Local Exchange Telecommunications Service Territory for Canby Telephone Association.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Reallocate Canby Telephone Association's local exchange telecommunications service territory using the boundaries of exchange maps filed with and approved by the Commission as set forth in Table 1. This reallocation replaces all previous territory allocations for Canby Telephone Association (Canby).

DISCUSSION:

The 2005 Legislature changed Oregon's territory allocation law for telecommunications utilities and telecommunications cooperatives. The new law allocates local exchange telecommunications service territory (service territory) as a geographic area within boundaries set forth in exchange maps filed with and approved by the Commission. This replaces the old "metes and bounds" descriptions. See ORS 759.500(1).

Section 27, chapter 232, Oregon Laws 2005, subsection (1) directs the Commission to: "Reallocate every allocated local exchange telecommunications service territory to a telecommunications utility, cooperative corporation or municipality to whom the Commission had previously allocated local exchange telecommunications service territory. Allocations granted by the commission pursuant to this subsection shall replace all allocations to telecommunications utilities, cooperative corporations or municipalities granted by the commission prior to January 1, 2006."

The Commission previously allocated local exchange telecommunications service territory to Canby in an order issued in 1986. Staff reviewed the Commission's records to identify all Canby territory allocation orders issued prior to January 1, 2006, and currently in effect. Staff then determined which of Canby's approved local exchange maps are encompassed in whole or in part by the metes and bounds descriptions in these previous territory allocation orders.

Canby has Commission-approved maps on file for the company's local exchange, Canby, issued in two parts. Staff concluded that both of Canby's maps are wholly or partially within the metes and bounds descriptions in the company's previous territory allocation order.

On August 30, 2007, Staff sent Canby a letter describing staff's conclusions in detail, and asking Canby to make corrections, if any, by September 20, 2007. Canby confirmed staff's basic conclusion regarding the relationship between the previous territory allocation order and the approved local exchange maps.

Table 1 describes reallocation for Canby in detail. Reallocations are identified by exchange name and the effective date of the corresponding Commission-approved exchange map. Previous allocation is identified by Commission order number.
