DISPOSITION: OAR 860-036-0030 AMENDED; OTHER PROPOSED RULE REVISIONS DENIED

The Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) opened this rulemaking docket on February 11, 2008, to consider amending the rules governing water utility regulation. On February 15, 2008, the Commission filed a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking Hearing and Statement of Need and Fiscal Impact with the Secretary of State. Notice was provided to certain legislators specified in ORS 183.335(1)(d) and to all interested persons on the service lists maintained pursuant to OAR 860-011-0001 on March 4, 2008.

Notice of the rulemaking was published in the March 2008 *Oregon Bulletin*. The Commission held a public hearing on April 21, 2008, and interested persons were given until that date to file written comments. Written comments were filed by Crooked River Ranch Water Cooperative (CRRWC), Melvin Olson, and Hiland Water Corporation. CRRWC filed a motion to extend the time for filing comments on April 28, 2008.

DISCUSSION AND RESOLUTION

The regulation of water utilities in Oregon is complicated. Although water utilities serving fewer than 500 customers are generally exempt from regulation, the governing statute provides opportunities for water utilities or water customers to request regulation under certain circumstances.¹ This statutory framework has resulted in multiple regulatory classifications, varying from unregulated to service regulated to rate regulated. The primary goal of this rulemaking is to clarify the applicability of the rules to the different water utility regulatory classifications.

To effectuate this goal, the Commission Staff used the existing water rules as a starting point. Unfortunately, the existing rules are complex and difficult to understand. Although we appreciate Staff's attempts to clarify these rules, we find that the proposed revisions ultimately fail to reach Staff's goal. We believe further revisions and refinements are necessary. Thus, with the one exception discussed below, we decline to adopt the

amended rules at this time and request that Staff continue to work on revising the rules in OAR Chapter 860, Division 036. When these further revisions are complete, we will open a new rulemaking docket and allow interested persons to file comments and participate in a public hearing. Given this decision, we deny CRRWC's request to extend the time to file comments in this docket.

As noted above, there is one rule that we find should be updated at this time. Under ORS 757.061(6), the customers of a water utility that is exempt from regulation have the opportunity to petition the Commission to regulate the utility if the utility's rates exceed certain regulatory thresholds. The Commission establishes these thresholds by rule.² We have not recently updated the current regulatory thresholds, which are set forth in OAR 860-036-0030.³ We therefore find that it is appropriate to update the regulatory threshold at this time and adopt the amendments to OAR 860-036-0030 set forth in Appendix A. Interested persons are welcome to submit further comments on the regulatory thresholds when the new rulemaking docket is opened.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The modifications to Oregon Administrative Rule 860-036-0030, as set forth in Appendix A, are adopted.
- 2. The amended rule becomes effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.

860-036-0030 Threshold Levels of Rates and Charges for Water Utilities Serving Fewer than 500

Customers

<u>As required by(1) Pursuant to</u> ORS 757.061(<u>7</u>2), the Commission adopts the following maximum rates and charges for water utilities <u>that are not rate regulated and</u> <u>are</u> serving fewer than 500 customers:

(a1) \$24<u>33</u> annual average monthly residential <u>rate;or small commercial service</u> rate;

(2) \$33 annual average monthly service rate for small commercial customers with a meter or pipe diameter one inch or less;

(b3) \$85110 annual average monthly service rate for large commercial customers with a meter or pipe diameter larger than one inch; and

(c) \$450 standard service connection.

(d4) Any <u>service connection charge</u>, system <u>developmentimpact</u> fee, facilities charge, <u>main line extension</u>, or other <u>likesimilar</u> charge <u>shallmust</u> be cost based<u>. and</u> <u>demonstrated as such to the Commission's satisfaction uUpon the Commission's</u> requestof the Commission, a water utility must be able to demonstrate compliance with this requirement.

(2) A standard service connection is defined in OAR 860-036-0060.
