DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On April 8, 2005, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to ATX Licensing Inc. (ATX) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 05-170. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to pay annual revenue fees to the Commission. After investigation, the Commission found that ATX failed to pay the revenue fees as required in ORS 756.310. On April 14, 2008, the Commission notified the certificate holder that the required fees were not received. At the May 6, 2008, public meeting, the Commission determined that ATX's certificate of authority should be canceled. ATX's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 08-283.

On May 30, 2008, ATX filed a request to suspend Order No. 08-283, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that ATX paid the requested fees.

The fees sent by ATX to the Commission were late. However, the fees have been received and indicate ATX is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of ATX's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 08-283 canceling the certificate of authority of ATX Licensing Inc., is rescinded.
