ORDER

DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On December 22, 1999, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to Monroe Area Communications Inc. (Monroe Area) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 99-772. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. After investigation, the Commission found that Monroe Area failed to file an annual report for the year 2007 as required by OAR 860-032-0060(2)(a). On June 10, 2008, the Commission notified Monroe Area that the report had not been received. At the July 29, 2008, public meeting, the Commission determined that Monroe Area's certificate of authority should be canceled. Monroe Area's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 08-402.


On August 11, 2008, Monroe Area filed a request to suspend Order No. 08-402, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that Monroe Area filed the requested information.


The information sent by Monroe Area to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates Monroe Area is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of Monroe Area's certificate should be rescinded.


ORDER


IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 08-402 canceling the certificate of authority of Monroe Area Communications Inc., is rescinded.
