## STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

The Portfolio Options Committee (POC) recommends that the Commission allow one year extensions of the contracts that both Portland General Electric (PGE) and PacifiCorp have with The Nature Conservancy (TNC).

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Customers who participate in either PGE or PacifiCorp's renewable options can choose to include a contribution directed towards habitat restoration. PGE customers can enroll in the "Habitat Option" when they enroll in either the Green Source or Clean Wind renewable options. PacifiCorp customers can choose to enroll in the Blue Sky Habitat program which is a usage based renewable product that includes a contribution for habitat restoration.

TNC has held the contract with both utilities for habitat restoration programs since 2004 when it was chosen as part of a competitive bidding process. These initial contracts were effective through December 2005. The contracts were then extended for one year through December 2006. On July 12, 2005, the Commission allowed extension of the contracts with TNC through December 2009 based on the recommendation of the POC.

The POC is now asking the Commission to allow a final one-year extension of the TNC contracts. Both utilities will be soliciting bids for green power marketers this year and conducting a request for proposals (RFP) for a new habitat restoration provider at the same time would be challenging for the POC to oversee. TNC updates the POC on a

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quarterly basis and both the utilities and the POC are satisfied that TNC is a conscientious steward of customer dollars. The POC concluded that delaying the competitive bidding process for the provider of habitat programs by one year is reasonable.

On February 6, 2009, the POC unanimously approved the following motion (PacifiCorp and NW Natural abstained):

The POC recommends that the Commission allow the utilities to extend the contract with TNC for one year and then be required to solicit bids for the habitat restoration provider after that one-year extension.

Staff confirmed that although the language of the motion may seem to say that the bidding activity would commence *after* the one-year extension, that activity will take place *during* the one-year extension so that a habitat restoration provider will be in place beginning January 1, 2011.

## PROPOSED COMMISSION MOTION:

PGE and PacifiCorp be allowed to extend the existing contracts with TNC for one year with a requirement to solicit bids for the habitat restoration provider during that one-year extension.

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
