**ORDER** 

Residential Service Protection Fund Surcharge Rate Review and Recommendation for Increase.

DISPOSITION: SURCHARGE UNCHANGED

Under Oregon law, the Commission must review the Residential Service Protection Fund (RSPF) surcharge amount once each year and ensure that the fund balance does not exceed six months' worth of projected expenses. Chapter 290, Oregon Laws 1987, Section 7(1) allows for a monthly surcharge to be assessed on each subscriber line, not to exceed \$.35 per line. The purpose of the surcharge is to provide revenue for three programs: Telecommunication Devices Access Program (TDAP), Oregon Telephone Assistance Program (OTAP), and Oregon Telecommunications Relay Service (OTRS).

RSPF is restricted by statute to maintaining a maximum six-month balance of projected expenses.<sup>1</sup> ). The current RSPF surcharge is \$.12 per line, and has been at this rate since January 1, 2010. Staff completed an annual review of the surcharge revenues, expenditures, and ending balances, and prepared a recommendation.

RSPF is restricted by statute to maintaining a maximum six-month balance of projected expenses.<sup>2</sup> Maintaining the surcharge at \$0.12 per line will continue to fund the three policy option packages as well as sustain the ending balance to match the estimated six month operating costs. The Commission adopted Staff's recommendation. A full description of the filing, its procedural history and Staff's recommendation are contained in the Staff Report, attached as Appendix A and incorporated by reference.

IT IS ORDERED that the Residential Service Protection Fund surcharge amount remains at \$.12 cents per subscriber line, effective January 1, 2011.



Surcharge Rate Review and Recommendation for Maintaining Current

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the monthly surcharge for the Residential Service Protection Fund (RSPF) remain \$0.12 per subscriber line, effective January 1, 2011.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

RSPF staff annually reviews the revenue and expenditures of the previous year and calculates projections for the next year to determine whether the current surcharge rate is sufficient to sustain expenditures and maintain a six-month reserve balance. Chapter 290, Oregon Laws 1987, §7(1) allows a monthly surcharge to be assessed on each subscriber line, not to exceed \$0.35 per line. The surcharge provides revenue for three telephone assistance programs: Telecommunication Devices Access Program (TDAP), Oregon Telephone Assistance Program (OTAP), and Oregon Telecommunications Relay Service (OTRS). By law, the RSPF balance may not exceed six months of projected expenses. The law further requires an annual review of the surcharge rate to determine its sufficiency. Proposed rate changes or reviews are submitted to the Commission for approval.

On November 24, 2009, the Commission adopted Staff's recommendation to increase the RSPF surcharge from \$0.09 to \$0.12 per line effective January 1, 2010, to fund the three policy option packages approved by the 2009-2011 Legislature as well as maintain the appropriate ending balance based on projected expenditures and revenue. See Order No. 09-465.

Maintaining the surcharge at \$0.12 per line will continue to fund the three policy option packages as well as sustain the ending balance to match the estimated six month operating costs. For instance, the ending balance for December 2010 at \$0.12 per line is projected to be \$2 million while the estimated six-month operating expense is currently \$2.3 million. The RSPF program is in compliance with Chapter 290, Oregon Laws 1987, §7(3) in which the balance does not exceed six months of projected expenditures.

Advice was sought from the OTRS Industry Advisory Committee and the TDAP Advisory Committee. Neither committee had any concerns regarding the proposed rate.
