CORRECTED; ORDER NO. 11-422 CORRECTED

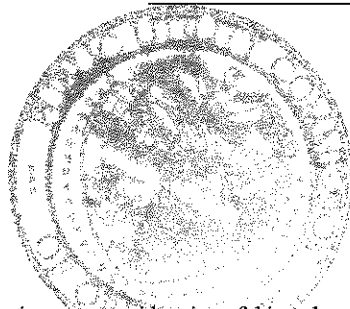
On October 25, 2011, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon approved an amendment to the Interconnection Agreement (IA), filed on August 2, 2011, by Silver Star Telecom, LLC and Qwest Corporation. *See* Order No. 11-422. On October 27, 2011, the Commission discovered that this amendment was incorrectly assigned and identified as a second amendment instead of a third amendment to the IA.

The Commission should correct its records and reassign the amendment filed on October 25, 2011, to be the third amendment to the IA or ARB 759(3). Also, all references in Order No. 11-422 to that amendment should be identified as the third amendment to the IA.

**ORDER**

IT IS ORDERED that the identity of the amendment filed on August 2, 2011, by Silver Star Telecom, LLC and Qwest Corporation be reassigned to be a third amendment or ARB 759(3), and all references to a second amendment stated in Order No. 11-422 are corrected to be the third amendment or ARB 759(3). The remainder of the order is unchanged.
