ORDER

DISPOSITION: MOTION FOR WAIVER GRANTED

On June 25, 2013, the Citizens' Utility Board of Oregon (CUB) requested a waiver of OAR 860-083-0350(4), which requires written comments on an annual renewable portfolio standard (RPS) compliance reports to be filed within 45 calendar days of the date of filing of the report. Given that much of the information in the RPS reports is confidential and discovery is necessary for a thorough review of the filing, CUB states that the parties support a waiver of the comment deadline. CUB requests that the 45 day comment period run from the date of the issuance of the protective order on June 18, 2013, and that the electric companies be allowed additional time to file a response to any comments.

CUB's request is reasonable and provides good cause for waiver of the rule under OAR 860-083-0005(2). The motion is granted. A procedural schedule will be adopted that requires Staff and Intervenors to file comments by August 2, 2013, and the electric companies will reply by September 10, 2013.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the motion for waiver filed by the Citizens' Utility Board of Oregon is granted.
