ORDER

DISPOSITION: CASE DISMISSED; DOCKET CLOSED

The Commission opened this docket on January 11, 2013, in anticipation of the decoupling mechanism evaluation report (Evaluation Report) to be filed later in the year. In February 2013, prior to the time the independent evaluator completed the Evaluation Report, Portland General Electric Company (PGE) filed a request for a general rate case (Docket No. UE 262) that included a request to continue implementation of the decoupling mechanism with no changes.

On July 25, 2013, parties to PGE's general rate case submitted a partial stipulation in which the parties agreed to support continuation of the decoupling mechanism until the end of 2016 with some changes. On August 20, 2013, Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon filed a motion asking that this case be closed, on the grounds that the need for this docket has been obviated by the developments in the general rate case. Staff reports that no party objects to its motion.

ORDER

It is ordered that Docket No. UM 1644 is dismissed and this docket is closed.
