STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

I recommend that the Commission allow Portland General Electric Company's (PGE or Company) Advice Nos. 2013-S6 to go into effect, with less than statutory notice, for meter readings on or after November 30, 2013¹.

DISCUSSION:

PGE filed Advice No. 2013-S6 on October 11, 2013. The filing was a request to update the steam contract with Upper Columbia Mill that is currently in place. The revised contract has an initial term of one year followed by a renewal clause authorizing a series of six one-year renewals.

The revised contract is nearly identical to the existing steam contract² as far as terms and requirements for the buyer and seller. The new contract differs from the existing contract on seven minor points:

- a) A quarterly steam repricing option has been removed. The contract steam price will be reset on the fifteenth of each month based on power market forward prices at Mid-C;
- b) The requirement that the buyer secure a \$250,000 letter of credit has been removed:

- c) The buyer's option to purchase 'sample steam' has been removed:
- d) The parties have agreed to define a "Technical Violation" in the event that the buyer fails to notice the seller for three or more occurrences of steam load fluctuations greater than 10,000 pounds per hour which occur within a 7 day window. Technical Violations contractually enable the seller (PGE) to shut off steam deliveries;
- e) Buyer demand shall not change more than 2000 pounds per minute for any 10 minute period;
- f) The two-tier pricing system based on on- and off-peak demand has been replaced with a single flat Mid-C index price; and
- g) Four new terms are defined: Agreement, Effective Date, Operations & Maintenance Cost, and Technical Violation.

Review:

Historically, Staff reviews of steam sale contracts have applied the relevant standards for special contracts that are set forth in ORS 757.230 and Order No. 87-402. Based on these standards, a review of a steam sale contract includes consideration of the following criteria: (1) The revenue generated from the steam sale should be sufficient to cover relevant costs; (2) Other PGE customers should be held harmless; and (3) The contract should not be discriminatory.

The slight changes in contract terms discussed above have no effect on the contract's continued compliance with these standards of review.

PROPOSED COMMISSION MOTION:

The Commission allow PGE's Advice Nos. 2013—S6 to go into effect with meter readings on or before November 30, 2013.
