ORDER

DISPOSITION: CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORITY CANCELED

On November 3, 1997, Covad Communications Company (Covad) was granted a certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 97-424. Covad's certificate of authority was transferred to MegaPath Corporation fka DIECA Communications, Inc. (MegaPath) on November 17, 2011. *See* Order No. 11-461.

In a letter dated January 8, 2015, Katherine K. Mudge, Executive Vice President and General Counsel for GC Pivotal, LLC dba Global Capacity, LLC (Global Capacity), requested the Commission cancel MegaPath's certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as ownership of certain network assets and certain customers served by those assets were transferred from MegaPath to Global Capacity. As a result of this, MegaPath will no longer provide telecommunications service in Oregon.

MegaPath is reminded that because it had a certificate of authority for one or more days in 2015, it is required to file a revenue statement and pay a minimum of \$100 for that year.

In view of the foregoing, the certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service in Oregon held by MegaPath Corporation should be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of authority held by MegaPath Corporation is canceled.
