ORDER

DISPOSITION: ADVICE NO. 15-01 ALLOWED TO GO INTO EFFECT ON LESS  
THAN STATUTORY NOTICE

In this order, we allow Advice No. 15-01, filed by Portland General Electric Company (PGE), to go into effect on January 29, 2015, on less than statutory notice.


The filing relates to the rate treatment for PGE's Port Westward 2 (PW2) generating facility. In Order No. 14-442, we approved rate schedules that included recovery of PW2 costs effective January 1, 2015. When informed that one of the twelve engines would not be placed in service by that date, we approved PGE's Advice No. 14-28 to provide customers a rate credit until the last engine was fully operational. That schedule addressed how the credit would terminate:

When PGE submits an attestation by an officer of the Company that Port Westward 2 facility is in service in its entirety, PGE will also simultaneously file a revised schedule, and an LSN, with an effective date two days hence, with prices set at zero for all Customers. A Commission order will be issued allowing the revised rates to go into effect upon satisfactory finding that PGE made the required filing of attestation.


On January 26, 2015, PGE filed Advice No. 15-01 to eliminate the rate credit. On that same date, PGE filed an attestation of Stephen Quennoz that the PW2 generating facility is now in service in its entirety.

IT IS ORDERED that Advice No. 15-01, filed by Portland General Electric Company, is allowed to go into effect on January 29, 2015, on less than statutory notice.
