DISPOSITION: PETITION FOR CASE CERTIFICATION AND PROPOSED BUDGET FOR ISSUE FUND GRANT DENIED AS MOOT

On April 27, 2017, the Small Business Utility Advocates (SBUA) filed a Petition for Case Certification under OAR 860-001-0120(4) and Article 5.3 of the Third Amended and Restated Intervenor Funding Agreement (IFA). On April 28, 2017, SBUA also filed a proposed budget for an issue fund grant in the amount of \$14,414.

We do not address the merits of SBUA's petition for case certification because we find it has been rendered moot. This rate proceeding will be concluded in this calendar year and all monies in Portland General Electric Company's Issue Fund are fully committed for 2017 (\$0 available). Given these facts, and because the IFA does not allow advances for Issue Fund grants, the application for case certification to obtain an issue fund grant in this docket has no practical value or meaning, and should be denied as moot.
