DESCRIPTION: NEW FUNDING SOURCE FOR INTERCOMMUNITY FUNDING

On August 28, 2007, the Urban and Community Development Committee (UCDC) of the Board of Supervisors (BOS) of the County of Santa Clara requested approval of the 2007/08 Intercommunity Funding (ICF) Fund Grant. Section 6.11 of the Intercommunity Funding Agreement (Agreement) adopted by the Commission in Ordinance 177-0224 governs the procedures for payment of ICF Fund Grants. UCDC was presented to receive Intercommunity Funding Grants on August 21, 2006, in Ordinance 06-5022.

UCDC is in a partial payment of \$2,477,280 from the State of California, under the Agreement. The request for payment is as follows:

- 1) Identify the expenses, progress, and liability of the amount to be received;
- 2) Demonstrate that the expenses are reasonable and have directly attributed to ICF activities on the behalf of a public health care services; and
- 3) Provide information sufficient to show that the Intercommunity Funding Agreement has complied with any conditions imposed on the ICF Fund Grant.

Further, under the terms of the Agreement, UCDC must establish that it has used no more resources on the funding than at least 200 percent of the eligible expenses from eligible preceding Agreement(s). UCDC provided the required documentation in its request.

The Agreement provides that the Commission will make a determination as to how the participating entities are to receive the funding grants from the various counties of the State. Section 6.6 of the Agreement provides that ICF Fund Grants provided to UCDC shall be allocated and managed to individual customers. Agreement at 11.

The Commission finds that UCDC has met the requirements of the Agreement, and the request should be approved. Section 6.6 of the Agreement provides that the ability must

pay the Issue Fund Grant to the requesting intervenor within 30 days after receipt of the Commission directive.

**ORDER**

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities has met the requirements of the Multi-State Process Second Amended and Restated Intervenor Funding Agreement, and its request is approved.
2. PacifiCorp, dba Pacific Power, pay \$36,547.38 from the MSP Fund to the Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities within 30 days after receipt of this order, and the grant be assessed to PacifiCorp's industrial customers.
