DISPOSITION: STIPULATION ADOPTED

On December 5, 2018, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon filed a complaint against defendant. The complaint charged defendant with one violation of law, OAR 952-001-0050(1), and requested a penalty of \$1,000. On December 5, 2018, a copy of the complaint was served.

On December 23, 2018, the parties in these proceedings entered into a stipulation, which is attached as Appendix A.

Under the terms of the stipulation, defendant admits committing the alleged violation and agrees that the Commission may enter an order assessing civil monetary penalties. Defendant also agrees to (i) complete, within 45 days following the entry of a final order, a training session with Cascade Natural Gas on operator safety, and (ii) to provide the Commission with a completed Training Verification form for all required training to the Commission within 10 days of the date of the last training and no later than 55 days following the entry of this order.

The parties further agree that the penalties should be suspended, unless defendant fails to comply with any provision of the stipulation or violates any rule adopted by the Oregon Utility Notification Center under ORS 757.552 for a period of one year following the date of the Commission's final order in these proceedings.

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The stipulation is adopted. From the foregoing, it is concluded that no hearing is required. Under the terms of the stipulation, the allegations of the complaint are true, and defendant has violated Oregon Administrative Rule as alleged. Under the provisions of ORS 757.993, penalties should be assessed against defendant under the terms and conditions of the stipulation.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The stipulation, attached as Appendix A, is adopted.
- 2. Civil monetary penalties shall be assessed against Sweeney Excavating, Inc., in the amount of \$1,000 for one violation of law.
- 3. Payment of the penalties (\$1,000) shall be suspended, unless:
 - (a) A showing is made that defendant has violated, within one year of the date of this order, any rules administered by the Oregon Utility Notification Center; or
 - (b) Defendant fails to timely complete a training session with Cascade Natural Gas. Defendant will contact Cascade Natural Gas to arrange for and ensure that Defendant and all of Defendant's employees that engage in excavation activity attend an excavation safety presentation within 45 days of the entry of this order; and
 - (c) Defendant fails to submit a completed Training Verification form for all required trainings to the Commission within 10 days of the date of the last training and no later than 55 days following the entry of this order.

4. Payment of the balance of the penalties (\$1,000) will be suspended, unless defendant fails to comply with any term of the stipulation. If the defendant has not met the requirements and time periods set forth in paragraphs 3 above, the unpaid balance of the amount assessed in paragraph 2 will be due immediately following the expiration of the time periods.



2	The	e parties further agree that the Commission may enter an order assessing a civil
3	monetary p	penalty against Defendant in the amount of \$1,000 under the following terms and
4	conditions	:
5	A.	Defendant must sign and return this Stipulation within 20 days of the date it was
6		served upon (mailed to) Defendant.
7	В.	Payment of the penalty (\$1,000) is suspended and will be waived with no further
8		penalties imposed for the violation alleged in the Complaint unless Defendant fails to
9		comply with all of the terms of this Stipulation and all of the administrative rules
10		adopted by the Oregon Utility Notification Center (OUNC) under ORS 757.552 for a
11		one-year period following the date of the Commission's entry of an order.
12	C.	Defendant must contact Cody Cox at Cascade Natural Gas (CNG) by email
13		Cody.Cox@cngc.com or by calling (541) 706-6281 and arrange for and ensure that
14		Defendant and all of Defendant's employees that engage in excavation activity attend
15		an excavation safety presentation provided by CNG within 45 days following the
16		entry of the Commission's order.
17	D.	Defendant must take a blank copy of the Training Verification form attached to this
18		Stipulation as Attachment 1 to all required trainings scheduled under paragraph 4.C.
19		above. Defendant must ensure that Defendant and all of its employees attending a
20		required training sign a Training Verification form to verify attendance. A
21		representative of the organization providing the training (Instructor) must sign the
22		Training Verification form to verify each person listed on the form completed the
23		training. Defendant must return all completed Training Verification forms to
24		Complainant at the address on the Form within 10 days of the date of the last training
25		session and in no event later than 55 days following the date of the Commission's
26		entry of an order in this docket.

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1	E. In the event that Complainant contends that Defendant has not complied with all of		
2	the terms of this Stipulation and all OUNC rules for that one-year period,		
3	Complainant may petition for imposition of all or a portion of the suspended		
4	penalties. In such case, Defendant is entitled to a notice and hearing on the basis		
5	upon which Complainant contends that compliance has not occurred.		
6	F. Complainant's failure to enforce any provision of this Stipulation, or decision to		
7	waive any violation or nonperformance of this Stipulation in one instance, will not		
8	constitute a waiver by the Complainant of that provision, any other provision, or any		
9	other violation or nonperformance in another instance.

11	This Stipulation is conditioned upon final approval of its terms by the Commission. If		
12 tł	ne Stipulation is not accepted in its entirety, it is deemed withdrawn.
