ORDER

DISPOSITION: FURTHER PHASE I PROCESS TO BE ESTABLISHED

This order memorializes our decision, made and effective at our October 22, 2019 Regular Public Meeting, to decline to adopt Staff's recommendation to find that Portland General Electric Company's implementation of its Green Energy Affinity Rider program, as described in its September 13, 2019 compliance filing, is non-compliant with Order No. 19-075. We determined to take no action on Portland General Electric Company's September 13, 2019 compliance filing regarding its Green Energy Affinity Rider program, to open a process to review and potentially amend Order No. 19-075 consistent with ORS 756.568, and to suspend the procedural schedule in docket UM 1953 Phase II while we do so.

The Commission orders that:

1. The Administrative Hearings Division shall suspend the Phase II procedural schedule in docket UM 1953.
2. The Administrative Hearings Division shall conduct a procedural conference to establish the process for review and clarification of Order No. 19-075 consistent with ORS 756.568.
3. The process regarding review and clarification of Order No. 19-075 will address, on a prospective basis, the appropriate, measurable or testable distinctions between the PGE Supply Option and the Customer Supply Option, the allocation of remaining program capacity between the PGE Supply Option and the Customer Supply Option, and any program procedures that would benefit from clarification, including queue procedures.

4. PGE is prohibited from offering or enrolling any additional customers under the PGE Supply Option until otherwise directed by the Commission.
