ORDER

**DISPOSITION: TIME LINE SPECIFIED IN ORDER NO. 19-313 AMENDED**

On September 26, 2019, the Commission issued Order No. 19-313, adopting a Staff recommendation, approving reauthorization of Portland General Electric Company's deferred accounting for costs for two Residential Demand Response Pilots, subject to conditions.

Three of these conditions were outlined by Staff as follows:

1. At least annually, and not less than 90 days prior to the filing to adjust Schedule 135 tariff rates, submit program costs (including forecasted program costs) to Staff for review of prudence.
2. No less than 90 days prior to filing to adjust tariff rates, hold at least one workshop to present pilot costs, findings, and any design updates.
3. No less than 90 days prior to filing to adjust tariff rates, submit two combined reports on the pilots, which will provide third-party evaluations, cost summaries, estimated curtailments, and results of customer satisfaction surveys.

PGE requests that the above dates be changed from "90 days" to "70 days" given unforeseen circumstances. Staff supports PGE's request.

The Chief Administrative Law Judge has been delegated the authority to modify time lines specified in a Commission order.<sup>1</sup> Exercising that authority, I find good cause to amend Order No. 19-313 to change the three conditions referenced above from “90 days” to “70 days”.
