## DISPOSITION: TIME LINE SPECIFIED IN ORDER NO. 19-313 FURTHER AMENDED

On August 14, 2020, the Commission issued Order No. 20-300, which amended timelines specified in Order No. 19-313. On September 18, 2020, Portland General Electric Company filed a request to waive timelines in that order, requesting that the Commission reduce the amount of days prior to the filing to adjust tariff rates from 70 to 40 days to provide Staff with appropriate time to review updates to Schedule 135 and adhere to PGE's timeline of having pricing effective on January 1, 2021. PGE states that this change is necessary given issues associated with Oregon wildfires.

The Chief Administrative Law Judge has been delegated the authority to modify time lines specified in a Commission order.<sup>1</sup> Exercising that authority, I find good cause to further amend Order No. 19-313, as amended by Order No. 20-300, to change the three conditions in that order from "70 days" to "40 days."
