ORDER

DISPOSITION: ORDER NO. 21-026 AMENDED

On January 28, 2021, the Commission issued Order No. 21-026, adopting an alternative Staff recommendation, suspending Portland General Electric Company's tariff sheets in Advice No. 20-17. In that order, the Commission suspended the tariff for nine months, but invited Staff and PGE to address issues associated with the filing as soon as practicable. The order also required that Staff submit a status report at a public meeting within 30 days, on the Transportation Line Allowance fleet proposal.

Staff, PGE, and stakeholders are working to address issues, and would like to push back the date for a public meeting report in Order No. 21-026 to accommodate a more complete update and proposal for the Commission.

The Chief Administrative Law Judge has been delegated the authority to modify time lines specified in a Commission order.¹ Exercising that authority, I amend Order No. 21-026 to change the requirement for a status update at a public meeting from "within 30 days" to "within 90 days."
