ORDER

DISPOSITION: TIMELINE SPECIFIED IN ORDER NO. 18-488 AMENDED

On April 23, 2024, Staff of the Public Utility Commission filed a motion in this docket to amend Order No. 18-488. Staff’s motion explains that the order, which adopted a stipulation signed by Government Camp Water Company, Inc., and Staff, requires the filing of a new rate case on or before June 1, 2024. Staff states it is now requesting a one-time modification to extend the deadline of filing a new rate case by the company on or before December 31, 2024. Staff also states because the first two quarters of the year being extremely busy for Government Camp, this extension would allow the company to develop and file a thorough and comprehensive rate case.

Order No. 18-488 incorporated the stipulation the motion seeks to amend. Accordingly, to effectively change the deadline for the filing of the general rate case, the order itself must be amended.

The Chief Administrative Law Judge has been delegated the authority to modify timelines specified in a Commission order.¹ Exercising that authority, I find good cause to amend Order No. 18-488, to change the incorporated stipulation requiring the filing of a general rate case “on or before June 1, 2024” to “on or before December 31, 2024.”
