DISPOSITION: STIPULATION ADOPTED/UW 64 DISMISSED

On March 8, 1999, Fish Mill Lodges Water System filed an application to terminate service. A prehearing conference and public comment meeting were held in Florence, Oregon, on November 4, 1999. On February 9, 2000, the Administrative Law Judge suspended the schedule at the parties' request to allow them to pursue settlement options.

On October 5, 2000, Staff and Fish Mill filed a Stipulation asking that this application be dismissed. The Stipulation sets out several other conditions. It also requests that Fish Mill's application for territorial allocation, dated January 24, 2000, and assigned the docket number WA 7, be granted and that the orders in these two cases be issued simultaneously. No objection to the Stipulation was filed.

Conclusion

The Commission has examined the Stipulation and the record in this case and in WA 7. We conclude that the Stipulation is in the public interest and should be granted. We will therefore adopt the Stipulation in its entirety. We will issue an order granting the application for territorial allocation at the same time this order is issued.

Order

IT IS ORDERED that the Stipulation in this case, attached to this order as Appendix A and incorporated herein, is adopted. UW 64 is dismissed and the docket closed.
