DISPOSITION: APPLICATION DENIED

On February 22, 2000, Champion Park Subdivision (Champion Park) applied to the Commission for allocation of its current service territory as required by Section 2, Chapter 695, Oregon Laws 1999.

On November 21, 2000, the Commission received a letter from Kellenbeck Property Management informing us that Champion Park is now connected to the City of Grants Pass water supply and is using the City as its exclusive water source. The existing well and pump that had served the subdivision are disconnected.

On January 3, 2001, counsel for Staff filed a letter recommending denial of the current application, based on the fact that Champion Park is no longer providing water service. Because the application for exclusive service territory was mandatory under Oregon Laws 1999, counsel recommends denial rather than dismissal of the application.

We conclude that Champion Park's application for exclusive service territory should be denied, because Champion Park is no longer providing water service.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the application of Champion Park Subdivision for exclusive service territory is denied.
