## DISPOSITION: STAFF RECOMMENDATION ADOPTED

Commission Order No. 97-240, issued June 25, 1997, set out interim operating instructions for continued service to First Hill Water, Inc.'s (First Hill) customers. Part of the instructions required that Staff establish a bank account to fund operation of the system, including the collection of revenues and payment of expenses. The instructions also required that Staff close the account when the interim arrangement was no longer needed.

The City of Bend (City) began serving First Hill customers in October 2000, ending the need for the interim arrangement. Pursuant to the Commission's instructions in Order No. 97-240, Staff closed the operating account and is completing a final accounting to support a recommendation to the Commission for disbursement of all residual funds from the account. Until the Commission orders final disbursement, Staff recommends placing the funds in an interest-bearing account from which disbursement can be made.

The Commission finds this recommendation reasonable and concludes that the funds from the operating account should be treated accordingly.

## ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Commission Staff shall place the funds from First Hill's operating account in an interest-bearing account from which disbursement will be made when a final accounting is completed.
