DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On July 13, 1998, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to Lightyear Telecommunications LLC (Lightyear) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 98-281. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. In July and October, 2000, Commission Staff requested information from Lightyear. The Commission's records indicated that the agency did not receive the requested information, so on January 2, 2001, Lightyear's certificate of authority was cancelled in Order No. 01-024.

On February 8, 2001, Lightyear filed a request to suspend Order No. 01-024, stating that it will submit its compliance filings in accordance with the Commission's rules and regulations on time in the future. A review of the Commission's records indicates that Lightyear filed the requested information on February 8, 2001.

The information sent by Lightyear to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates Lightyear is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of Lightyear's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 01-024 canceling the certificate of authority of Lightyear Telecommunications LLC, is rescinded.
