DISPOSITION: RATES SUSPENDED

On May 15, 2000, Qwest Corporation (Qwest) filed a petition to exempt from regulation Frame Relay Services (FRS), Asynchronous Transfer Mode/Call Relay Service (ATM/CRS), and Local Area Network Switching Service (LSS). At the July 10, 2000, Commission public meeting, the Commission voted to suspend Qwest's rates and investigate the petition. Rates under the tariff Qwest filed with its application were suspended pending investigation. A suspension order was entered on August 30, 2000. A second suspension order was entered on December 20, 2000.

On March 12, 2001, Qwest filed a request for a further extension period. Qwest asks for a suspension of an additional three months. Accordingly, the effective date for any new rates would be June 15, 2001.

Qwest asserts that good cause exists for such an extension. Qwest is in the process of analyzing the data sent in response to Qwest's questionnaires. This information is an important part of the investigation, and Qwest requires more time to analyze the information fully. The investigation process will not be complete by March 15, the date the second suspension ends. Therefore, good cause exists for a further extension. Neither Staff nor the intervenor, Sprint, opposes such an extension.

The Commission finds that the investigation into this matter will not be completed at the expiration of the second suspension. The Commission grants Qwest's request for a further suspension of three months of its petition to exempt from regulation FRS, ATM/CRS, and LSS services.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Qwest's petition to exempt from regulation FRS, ATM/CRS, and LSS services is suspended until June 15, 2001.
