DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On September 28, 2000, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to eVulkan Inc. (eVulkan) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No.00-603. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. In January and March, 2001, Commission Staff requested information from eVulkan. The Commission's records indicated that the agency did not receive the requested information. At the April 17, 2001 public meeting, the Commission determined that eVulkan's certificate of authority should be canceled. eVulkan's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 01-348.

On June 15, 2001, eVulkan filed a request to suspend Order No. 01-348, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that eVulkan filed the requested information on April 16, 2001.

The information sent by eVulkan to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates eVulkan is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of eVulkan's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 01-348 canceling the certificate of authority of eVulkan Inc., is rescinded.
