ORDER

DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On August 9, 1999, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to Voice Vision International Inc. (VVII) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 99-480. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. In January and February, 2001, Commission Staff requested information from VVII. The Commission's records indicated that the agency did not receive the requested information. At the April 17, 2001 public meeting, the Commission determined that VVII's certificate of authority should be canceled. VVII's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 01-360.

On June 15, 2001, VVII filed a request to suspend Order No. 01-360, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that VVII filed the requested information on June 20, 2001.

The information sent by VVII to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates VVII is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of VVII's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 01-360 canceling the certificate of authority of Voice Vision International Inc., is rescinded.
