DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On September 28, 2000, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to Nexbell Communications Inc. (Nexbell) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 00-605. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. In January and March, 2001, Commission Staff requested information from Nexbell. The Commission's records indicated that the agency did not receive the requested information. At the April 17, 2001 public meeting, the Commission determined that Nexbell's certificate of authority should be canceled. Nexbell's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 01-344.

On June 14, 2001, Nexbell filed a request to suspend Order No. 01-344, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that Nexbell filed the requested information on June 6, 2001.

The information sent by Nexbell to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates Nexbell is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of Nexbell's certificate should be rescinded.
