**DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED**

On December 3, 2003, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to One Eighty Networks Inc., (One Eighty) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 03-723.

Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. After investigation, the Commission found that One Eighty failed to file an annual fee statement and pay its fee for the year 2004 as required by OAR 860-032-0095. The Commission notified One Eighty several times that the statement had not been received. At the August 2, 2005, public meeting, the Commission determined that One Eighty's certificate of authority should be canceled. One Eighty's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 05-943.

On October 20, 2005, One Eighty filed a request to suspend Order No. 05-943, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that One Eighty filed the requested information and Order No. 06-020 was entered on January 18, 2006 reinstating One Eighty's certificate of authority.

Again, after investigation, the Commission found that One Eighty failed to file the 2006 Annual Report as required by OAR 860-032-0060(2)(a). On May 2, 2007, the Commission notified One Eighty that the report had not been received. At the July 10, 2007, public meeting, the Commission determined that One Eighty's certificate of authority should be canceled. One Eighty's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 07-301. On July 27, 2007, One Eighty filed a request to suspend Order No. 07-301, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that One Eighty filed the requested information.


The information sent by One Eighty to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates One Eighty is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of One Eighty's certificate should be rescinded.

The Commission notes that this is the second time that One Eighty has sought reinstatement following the cancellation of its authority. Under these circumstances, the Commission emphasizes the need for One Eighty to fully comply with the Commission's rules and regulations in the future. If One Eighty again fails to fulfill its regulatory obligations, the Commission may conclude that it is not in the public interest to process a future application for re-certification as a competitive provider.

**ORDER**

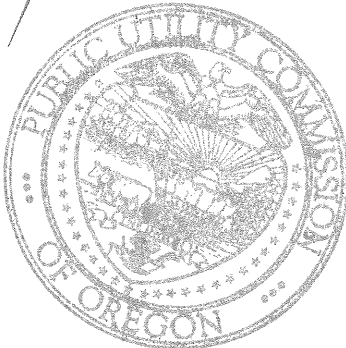
IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 07-301 canceling the certificate of authority of One Eighty Networks, Inc, is rescinded.
