DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On January 31, 2000, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to PriorityOne Telecommunications Inc. (PriorityOne) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 00-044. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to pay annual revenue fees to the Commission. After investigation, the Commission found that PriorityOne failed to pay the revenue fees as required in ORS 756.310. On April 14, 2008, the Commission notified the certificate holder that the required fees were not received. At the May 6, 2008, public meeting, the Commission determined that PriorityOne's certificate of authority should be canceled. PriorityOne's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 08-274.

On June 23, 2008, PriorityOne filed a request to suspend Order No. 08-274, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that PriorityOne paid the requested fees.

The fees sent by PriorityOne to the Commission were late. However, the fees have been received and indicate PriorityOne is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of PriorityOne's certificate should be rescinded.


ORDER
